### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college follows the Calcutta University curriculum, so there is little scope of internal curriculum change.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- a) The teacher & students has close interaction to aid the teaching and learning process.
- b) The teachers use both modern ICT Resources as well as classroom teaching method.
- c) Gradually increased the number of books and magazines in the Library
- d) Gradually replaced the wooden blackboards by modern synthetic boards
- e) Results of examinations at different stages are analyzed and steps are taken for further improvement.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

As per Calcutta University guidelines, students appear for Mid-Team and Test Examinations. Students also appear for regular tutorials and class test. Scope for review of University results is available.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The faculty members also engage in research activities and many of their articles are published. The students are also encouraged to engage in research activities. Certain Minor Research Projects have been completed while some others are in progress.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The library is partially digitalized. A number of initiatives by the college authority is being planned to enhance the efficiency of the college Library. Among these steps, is enhancing the library infrastructure and the other is digitisation of the Library books.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Measures are being taken to augment the staff-strength. Requisition for the post of Principal and six Assistant Professors for different departments has also been submitted to the West Bengal College Service Commission.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- a) Full time faculties are appointed by the recommendation of West Bengal College Service Commission as per guidelines of UGC.
- b) There is shortage of both teaching and non-teaching staff, since the entire process solely depends on government regulations.

Industry interaction is a healthy practice of the College for identifying the position of academic growth in the College. However, in this academic session the college could not conduct industry interaction/ collaboration.

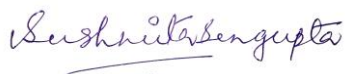

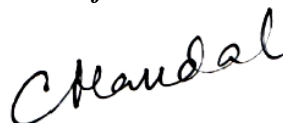

### (1) Best Practices of the Institution (2015-16)

**Title of the Practice:** Drive for tree plantation and improvement of greenery at college campus.

**Goal:** To improve the overall greenery and to enhance the eco-friendliness of the college campus.

**The Context:** Although Baruipur College is situated in a remote, rural area, but the college has always strived to improve the greenery in and around the college campus.

**The Practice:** In collaboration with a private banking organization the college procured a number of saplings. All the saplings were planted within the college campus. A number of teaching staff and students were involved in the plantation process.

**Evidence of Success:** Presently the saplings have grown into small trees that are contributing to the overall greenery, beautification and eco-friendliness of the college campus.

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## **(2) Best Practices of the Institution (2015-16)**

**Title of the Practice:** Extension and elevation of playground to provide better games and sports facilities to the college students.

**Goal:** To extend and elevate the college ground which would increase the scope for outdoor games and sports.

**The Context:** Considering the number of students, the college ground was relatively small and the west side of the college ground was uneven and needed to be elevated.

**The Practice:** With help from the local municipality the college ground was extended towards the west of the college. More than 89 trucks full of soil were deposited to extend and elevate the college ground. The local municipality offered their help and supplied the soil at a reduced cost for the benefit of the college.

**Evidence of Success:** Presently the students can play at the extended and elevated college ground. This has increased the recreational opportunities of the students.

**Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** The college ground was relatively small in relation to the number of students enrolled. Hence, the college wanted to extend the college ground to provide ample space to the students for games and sports. Moreover, the west side of the college ground was uneven and lower than the rest of the ground level. Therefore, the college authority collaborated with the local municipality to acquire soil at a reduced cost and elevated the ground level and extended the ground for the benefit of the students.
